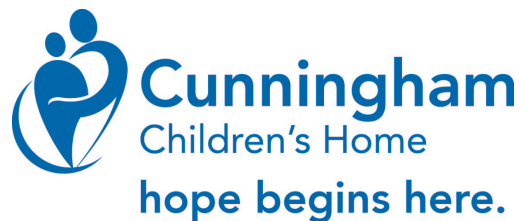

ERC SPACE	DESCRIPTION AND USE	NAMING VALUE
Education Center	2 separate school areas (residential to the south and therapeutic day to the north) with offices, reception areas, and specialized life skills, sensory, and small classroom areas in the center of the facility. Schools can be self-contained by closing doors to the shared hallways.	\$5,000,000 to \$7,000,000
Recreation Center	Gymnasium, fitness center, locker rooms, separate spaces for art, music, other recreational therapies, and special events and celebrations. Shared space for both schools. The gymnasium has been named in honor of Lou and Mary Henson.	\$2,000,000 to \$3,000,000
Day School	7 classrooms, each with pull-out space (allows students who are unable to focus with the noise and distractions of a full classroom to work with an aide while remaining nearby), 2 social workers' offices, multi-use space, 3 sensory rooms, and 3 seclusion rooms situated close to the classrooms; 1 small classroom for youth with profound disabilities requiring 1-2 aides.	\$1,000,000
Residential School	6 classrooms, each with pull-out space; 2 sensory spaces of different sizes to allow for large and small motor activities; a refocus room as an interim step between classroom pull-out and seclusion; 2 seclusion areas; a multi-use office for speech therapy and occupational therapy; Title I space for enrichment activities and administrative tasks related to funding for low-income students.	\$1,000,000
Cafeteria	Shared space for both schools (students and staff) with flexible seating and a serving area. Available for breakfast, lunch, and possibly dinner for residents, as well as special celebrations and events.	\$500,000
Kitchen	Expanded food preparation and storage area with a cooler, freezer, dishwashing station and new equipment. Large storage spaces for a more efficient and cost-effective inventory and faster service. Small office space for meal planning, ordering food and supplies, recordkeeping, and staff meetings.	\$500,000
Classrooms (13)	Spacious rooms with flexible seating (for small groups, individuals, and aides) to accommodate students up to 4 years apart in age and at different grade levels. A pull-out space in each classroom for youth who need time away from classroom distractions. Controlled lighting and temperature regulation. Locked storage space in each room to enhance orderliness and prevent distractions.	\$200,000 each
Fitness Room	Space created between the boys' and girls' locker rooms for stationary bikes, exercise mats, immovable weight machines, and other small equipment that can be used for individual and small group activities and physical therapy. Lobby area to allow for entry and exit without walking through other areas of the building; e.g., for after-hours use.	\$200,000

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Art Room	Therapy space in the Recreation Center shared by both schools. Stations for different art media to allow students to work in one area, gain mastery, and move on to another activity at their own pace. Space includes easels, a pottery wheel and kiln, large and small work tables, AV equipment (for slides), locked storage space, a working sink, and display areas for finished artwork.	\$150,000
Music Room	Therapy space for individual and group music classes, lessons, practice sessions, worship groups, and music appreciation activities for both schools. Available after hours. Equipped with a keyboard, drums and other percussion instruments, and recorders with locked storage. Flexible seating and sound-proofing to improve acoustics in neighboring spaces.	\$150,000
Sensory Room	Space dedicated to therapeutic activities for youth with sensory deficits due to trauma, mental illness, autism, and other conditions that interfere with self-regulation. Room accommodates large motor activities (mats for running and jumping).	\$150,000
Life Skills Classroom	Space for individualized speech and occupational therapy sessions. Available for behavior interventionists during the school day.	\$125,000
Special Therapies Rooms (2 of 3 available)	Shared space for both schools with flexible seating for different student groupings. Used for therapy groups (self-esteem, anger management, anti-bullying, etc.), cooperative games, pet therapy, and other activities during and after school. <i>Titled Multi-use Offices on floor plan.</i>	\$100,000 each
Refocus Rooms (2)	Separate pull-out space for youth who cannot be accommodated in the classroom pull-outs but do not require seclusion. Calm environment for behavior intervention specialists to work with one or more students on specific "positive growth" activities.	\$100,000 each
Teacher's Lounge/ Resource Room	Shared space for both schools to accommodate breaks, promote staff collaboration and support, and provide a repository for professional resources, curricula, AV materials, etc.	\$100,000

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Therapeutic Intervention Rooms (2)	Behavior intervention and reading support for youth in need of individualized support or for youth grouped by ability level. Located in the shared facilities. <i>Titled Classrooms in Shared Facilities on floor plan.</i>	\$75,000 each
Director of Education (Principal) Offices (2)	Administrative office for the director of each school	\$75,000 each
Coordinator Office	In the day school, shared office space for behavior intervention and other specialists, with a pull-out space for 1:1 activities.	\$75,000
Gym Office	Physical education and recreation office for school and therapy staff who use the gym and fitness center for youth activities, including gym classes, athletic teams, group events, etc. Large locked storage spaces for sports and exercise equipment.	\$75,000
Title I Office	Space dedicated for case managers and other staff who are responsible for providing Title One services to students who are failing, or most at risk of failing, to meet state academic standards. The office will be used for academic enrichment services for youth, meeting space for low-income families served through Title One, as well as recordkeeping and reporting.	\$50,000
Nurse's Office	Space for school health staff to assess acute injury or illness, manage student medications, make arrangements for referrals, and keep all student health records. Examination space and locked storage.	\$50,000
Small Sensory Rooms (5)	Space dedicated to therapeutic activities for youth with sensory deficits due to trauma, mental illness, autism, and other conditions that interfere with self-regulation. Used by 1 to 2 youth at a time with a therapist. Storage space with a variety of toys, supplies, and equipment that stimulate and soothe all senses. Smaller rooms are used for calming, stress-relief activities (bean bag chairs, weighted blankets, toys).	\$50,000 each
Assistant Principal Offices (2)	Administrative office for the vice principal of each school.	\$50,000 each
Social Work Offices (3)	Two counseling spaces for social workers in the day school and one in the residential school (residential students also receive therapy at the RTC). Each accommodates 1-2 youth and a social worker. May be used for small family sessions. Locked storage for records.	\$35,000 each
Waiting Area	Comfortable space for visitors who are waiting for appointments or meetings.	\$35,000
Small Therapy Room	Shared space for both schools to provide individualized recreational therapy or to offer a pull-out space for youth participating in group programs. Flexible seating and work space.	\$35,000
Conference Rooms (1 of 2 available)	Shared space for intake and family discussions, staff planning, professional development, and interagency meeting. Different sizes accommodate small or large groups. Conference seating and AV capability.	\$30,000 each
